ISA's Chief Road Concessions Officer retires from his position

ISA's Chief Road Concessions Officer, Ernesto Carrasco, announced that he will leave his position as of August 1, 2022, for strictly personal reasons, as stated in a letter in which he expresses his deep gratitude to the company and its directors.

The company regrets his decision and acknowledges and appreciates Ernesto's management during his nearly 2 years in the position. The company will immediately begin the selection process for the new Chief Road Concessions Officer.

The leadership of the business will be temporarily assumed by ISA's affiliate Intervial Chile, through its CEO Eduardo Larrabe Lucero, who has extensive experience and recognition in the road concessions industry. Eduardo holds a degree in Civil Engineering with a major in Structures from the Universidad de Chile. He has a track record of more than 22 years in the road concessions industry and more than 38 years linked to the infrastructure construction sector. He has developed works such as the reconstruction of the infrastructure that was damaged by the earthquake of February 27, 2010, in Chile, among other important projects. Larrabe was CEO of the Talca-Chillán concessionaire, the first concession in Chile, and CEO of Ruta del Maipo. In 2011, with the arrival of ISA in Chile, he became the CEO of ISA Intervial Chile.

The road concessions business unit plays a relevant role in ISA's portfolio as it is a source of diversification. Of the total investment to 2030, approximately 24% is expected to be made in this line of business. The company's investment plan for that year includes USD 12,5 billion for growth, of which approximately USD 2,9 billion is expected to be allocated to the road concessions business unit.
